OUR CHAMFERED PSYCHE

- Presented in Dr. Joshua Austin's trademark comedic style, this course explores strategies for working together to improve mental health so we can be our best. It is time to remove the taboo and face the facts.
- Dental professionals often examine the physical aspects of wellness yet we rarely explore or discuss the mental aspects.
- Anxiety, pain, depression, burnout. Dentistry can be difficult and take a toll. Studies show us that dental professionals experience a high incidence of mental illness. Additionally, many dental professionals don't clearly understand the mental health conditions that our patients present with, which red flags to watch for or what to do/how to intervene.
- A graduate of the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio Dental School, Joshua served five years post-graduation as faculty in the Department of Restorative Dentistry. Today he maintains a full-time restorative dentistry private practice in San Antonio, Texas.
- Joshua has been honored with several awards during his dental career. In 2009, the Texas Dental Association named him Young Dentist of the Year. In 2010, the Texas Academy of General Dentistry named him New Dentist of the Year. Joshua has earned a Mastership in the Academy of General Dentistry. In 2014, Joshua was awarded with a Fellowship in the American College of Dentists for his outstanding commitment to ethics in patient care.

FULL ARCH IMPLANT SOLUTIONS - FIXED OR REMOVABLE?

- We will discuss the treatment options for full arch tooth replacement. Fundamentals of restorative height, material thickness, implant positions, and the process from surgery to final prosthetic. The talk will also center on complications associated with these treatment modalities, how to handle them and what the long term maintenance of these prosthetics could be.
- Dr. Moody attended the University of Nebraska and received his doctorate at the University of Oklahoma College of Dentistry. He returned to his hometown of Crawford, Nebraska, upon graduation in 1997 and opened his first practice. Since graduation, Dr. Moody has been active in continuing education and implant dentistry, and in 2008 he limited his practice to the field of implants. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral Implantology; Honored Fellow, Fellow and Associate Fellow with the American Academy of Implant Dentistry; Diplomate, Master and Fellow with the International Congress of Oral Implantologists; Faculty at NYI, Adjunct Professor at the University of Nebraska Medical Center; Mentor at the Kois Center in Seattle WA; Implant Advisory Board member at Dentistry Today and is an Advisory Board Member for Dental Economics. Dr. Moody lectures internationally and currently runs the educational institute Implant Pathway in Tempe, AZ, where he conducts live implant surgery training at the 501c3 non-profit dental clinic New Horizon Institute taking care of our nation's veterans and those in need. He can also be heard on "Dentists, Implants and Worms" and the "AAID" podcasts.

TROUBLESHOOTING THE “MANDIBULAR BLOCK”

- Is the ‘mandibular block’ passé? Come hear for yourself! Local anesthesia forms the backbone of pain control techniques in contemporary dental practice. The subject of pain control in dentistry has undergone a recent renewal of interest, a renaissance of sorts. In this program Dr. Malamed will present an in-depth discussion of the problem in achieving mandibular anesthesia.
- The traditional ‘mandibular nerve block’ has one of the lowest success rates of major nerve blocks administered in the human body. Is it necessary for the doctor or hygienist to still administer this technique? Techniques, such as the Gow-Gates mandibular nerve block, Akinosi-Vazirani closed mouth mandibular nerve block, intraosseous anesthesia, periodontal ligament injection and intraseptal techniques have been developed in an effort to improve success in the mandible. The local anesthetic articaine HCl has been demonstrated to have significant success when administered by mandibular infiltration in adults, while more recently the ability to buffer local anesthetic solutions has demonstrated potential to both increase the rate of onset of anesthesia as well as increasing its depth. These techniques will be reviewed in this program.

CARDIOVASCULAR EMERGENCIES IN THE DENTAL OFFICE

- Medical emergencies can, and do, occur in the practice of dentistry. The occurrence of cardiovascular problems, such as angina, myocardial infarction and sudden cardiac arrest are likely to increase with the graying of the American population. In this program Dr. Malamed will address these problems and the means to prepare the dental office to effectively recognize and manage those that might arise. The use and importance of AEDs will be stressed. Bring the entire office staff to this program. The life you save may be your own!
- Stanley F. Malamed is a dentist anesthesiologist and emeritus professor of dentistry at the Herman Ostrow School of Dentistry, located in Los Angeles, California, USA. Dr. Malamed graduated from the New York University College of Dentistry in 1969 and then completed a residency in anesthesiology at Montefiore Hospital and Medical Center in the Bronx, New York before serving for 2 years as a captain in the U.S. Army Dental Corps at Ft. Knox, Kentucky. In 1973, he joined the faculty of the University of Southern California School of Dentistry (now the Herman Ostrow School of Dentistry of U.S.C.). Dr. Malamed retired from full-time teaching at the university in 2013.

SOLVING OCCLUSAL PROBLEMS IN A DIGITAL WORLD

- Digital workflows in the dental profession are evolving at an incredibly rapid rate. While these technological advances have the capacity to increase predictability, efficiency as well as profitability, utilizing them in the absence of sound esthetic, functional, and occlusal principles, can actually create more harm than good. In this program you will learn how to align sound occlusal (as well as esthetic and biologic) principles, with digital workflows to increase accuracy as well as the speed in which you can deliver care. Special emphasis will be placed on visualizing and creating sound occlusal contacts that will manage force appropriately in simple as well as complex situations. Utilizing digital/virtual articulation to do wax ups, perform trial equilibration, visualize orthodontic outcomes, design and create occlusal splints will all be part of this seminar. Come and find out why there has never been a better time to make the transition to digital!
- Dr. John Cranham practices in Chesapeake, Virginia focusing on esthetic dentistry, implant dentistry, occlusal reconstruction, TMJ/Facial Pain and solving complex problems with an interdisciplinary focus. He is an honors graduate of Virginia Commonwealth University in 1988. He served the school as a part time clinical instructor from 1991-1998 earning the student given part time faculty of the year twice during his stint at the university. After studying from the greats in occlusion (Pete Dawson & The Pankey Institute) and Cosmetic Dentistry (Nash, Dickerson, Hornbrook, Rosental, Spear, Kois) during the 1990's, Dr. Cranham created a lecture in 1997 called The Cosmetic Occlusal Connection. This one day lecture kept him very busy traveling the world, presenting his workflows on these seemingly diametrically opposed ideas. In 2001 he created Cranham Dental Seminars which provided, both lecture, and intensive hands on opportunities to learn.
